SCHOLA RSHIPS

The Foundation is pleased to report that the number of annual scholarships and participating chapters has continued to increase. The current number of scholarships represents a 15 percent increase over the total from fiscal year 2008, and the addition of three participating chapters.



STEPHANIE TUBBS JONES SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Sadly during this reporting period, we mourned the loss of a dedicated Delta Sigma Theta member and one of our country's most brilliant, ground-breaking and courageous public officials, the late Congresswoman Stephanie Tubbs Jones. In honor of their friend and her commitment to service as exemplified by the Sorority's mission,

The Honorable Hillary Clinton and former President William Jefferson Clinton designated The Delta Foundation as the vehicle for their support for the newly formed Stephanie Tubbs Jones Scholarship Fund. A formal announcement of the Fund's focus is expected next year.

OLETA L. CRAIN SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Oleta L. Crain Scholarship Fund was established in 2007 and was fully funded in 2009. The initial scholarships will be awarded during the 2009 Central Regional Conference to a student from Colorado, Missouri, and Oklahoma for a total of three scholarship awards.

RESTRICTED ACCOUNT SCHOLARSHIPS

The Delta Foundation continues to issue scholarships annually from its restricted accounts maintained for the benefit of Delta chapters. During fiscal year 2009, the Foundation issued more than 75 scholarships on behalf of 15 chapters. The scholarships ranged in size from \$250 to \$5,000 and were issued to male and female students either entering college or continuing their academic programs.

Students who received the scholarships met both academic and community service requirements.



COMMUNITY-BASED GRANT MAKING

This year, the nation's economic downturn touched every community; strained public social services infrastructures and further eroded economically dependent, community-based organizations that worked overtime with dwindling resources. The Delta Foundation responded to the acute needs of women, children and the communities where they live through the awarding of 17 grants in support of program initiatives that complement The Foundation's mission. Each grant awarded addressed at least one of Delta Sigma Theta's Five-Point Program Thrusts which included: Economic

AND PROGRAM PARTNERSHIPS

Development; Educational Development; International Awareness and Involvement; Mental and Physical Health, and Political Awareness and Involvement. In addition, innovation, overall focus on women and their families, and implications for social change are key factors in awarding grant dollars.

Highlighted are two examples of how partnerships created possibilities and made a difference.



The 40-hour Personal Care Aide Program prepared five women for employment with state-regulated agencies contracted to provide quality home health care services to elderly and disabled citizens living in the rural community. Successful completion of the training program provided the women with new job skills, employment opportunities, and a career path in the nursing profession. Since the program's launch, the Franklin-Tri County Alumnae Chapter has received many calls from local residents interested in enrollment. Participants are making a tangible difference in the lives of the patients they serve. As program graduate Cassandra Clark said, "We make a big difference in the lives of our seniors....Sometimes, I'm the only person they see regularly... They're concerned about me and I'm concerned about them. I just want to be there for them."

LAWNDALE SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAM

Learning that additional funding had become available, the number grew to 30 students and included three, 18 to 24-year-old students to serve as supervisors and advocates.

In addition to their internships at community-based sites, students participated in weekly program development sessions focused on service learning opportunities, controversial "hot topics," team building, money management, leadership development, healthcare, and

prevention education, to name a few discussion areas.
Overall, the summer activities achieved Lawndale's and The Delta Foundation's objectives to partner for possibilities.

CHARITABLE GIVING SERVICES

The Delta Foundation refined, strengthened and expanded its mission-driven work to make charitable giving services available to local Delta chapters. The goal throughout the year was to improve outcomes by enhancing the chapters' ability to identify potential funding sources, teach successful techniques to secure grant awards or stage fundraising events, and introduce or remind chapter leadership about the Foundation's comprehensive fiscal management and grant review services. As of this annual reporting period, 144 Delta chapters have taken advantage of the Foundation's services.

The following example represents how one local chapter successfully and seamlessly utilized The Delta Foundation's charitable giving services and plans to continue the relationship for future grant opportunities.

The Baltimore County (MD) Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta established the Delta Community Outreach Center in response to the many challenges facing Baltimore County's low income families. The Chapter's vision for their center was to create a safe, vibrant model community haven where residents of the Liberty Road Corridor could access a myriad of services and information, learn about training, education, and professional development opportunities, offer cultural awareness programs, and offer "safe harbor" for children and youth living in a high crime and

violent neighborhood. The Youth Risk Reduction program, when funded would provide daily afterschool, summer bridge, and constructive entertainment activities for 85 youth.

The Chapter identified several potential funding sources including the Baltimore County Office of Community Conservation, the County Police Department, the Governor's Office on Crime Control and Prevention, and the United Way. As a service to the Chapter, the Foundation reviewed the proposals prior to submission ensuring that the documents met the funders'

application requirements and the Foundation's mission.

Currently funded and operational, the Chapter continues to utilize the Foundation's efficient and expert fiscal management services resulting in more time focused on the youth and meeting the program objectives.

CULTU RES OF GIVING

The purpose of the Cultures of Giving (COG) initiative is to empower emerging donor communities of color to lead, develop and grow philanthropic resources that address community causes.



In September 2008, The Delta Foundation received its second grant from the Rockefeller Philanthropy Advisors' Cultures of Giving Fund to support the continued development and implementation of fundraising training sessions for Delta chapters. The purpose of the Cultures of Giving (COG) initiative


is to empower emerging donor communities of color to lead, develop and grow philanthropic resources that address community causes. The Delta Foundation developed and launched culturallyspecific fundraising trainings in order to provide Delta chapters with new, effective fundraising approaches and

ultimately increase the funds raised to support local community service programming.

The Foundation's project "Raising Funds for Delta Programs and Projects" met its goal to use Delta trainers from seven regions to conduct its fund development workshops. Before the project concludes in 2010, it is anticipated that more than 2,000 Delta members and approximately 100 women from other nonprofit organizations will have received the fundraising for social change training. Additionally, a broader array of programs benefitting African American women and their families are expected to find appropriate funding sources with sufficient funding levels.



RESEARCH AND PUBLIC DIALOGUE ON SOCIOECO NOMIC POLICY ISSUES



National Reading Circle & Sister Scholars Advisory Council

The Delta Foundation's Center for Research on African American Women (The Center) entered a new, energetic, and exciting phase of its mission to foster research and dialogue on issues affecting African American women. Under the guiding leadership of Chairperson Dr. Alison J. Harmon, the newly constituted, 12-member Sister Scholars Advisory Council convened to address its organizational mandate to offer advice, counsel

and direction in fulfilling The Center's mission and shaping its future.

The Council, representing The Center, The Delta Foundation, and Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.'s National Commission on Arts and Letters, initiated the National Reading Circle and selected as the inaugural book, IDA: A Sword Among Lions, written by award-winning author, member of the

Sister Scholars Advisory Council, and Delta member Paula J. Giddings. Plans call for an aggressive schedule of Reading Circle events throughout the 2009-2010 fiscal year to create a national presence for The Center, to generate book sales, and to promote reading scholarly works by and about women of color.



Over 1,000 Delta members listened to reports from The Honorable Marcia L. Fudge (D-OH), the Honorable Donna Edwards (D-MD), and the Honorable Yvette Clark (D-NY).

COFFEE AND CONVERSATION WITH OUR CONGRESSWOMEN

During the annual Delta Days legislative affairs conference, The Center, under the The Delta Foundation's direction, sponsored a program entitled, "Coffee and Conversation with Our Congresswomen." Over 1,000 Delta members listened to reports from The Honorable Donna Edwards (D-MD); the Honorable Yvette Clark (D-NY), and the Honorable Marcia L. Fudge (D-OH) including their perspectives on the historic national election, the inauguration of the first African American president, and their outlook for the Obama Administration during the interactive session. Of particular note, The Center took this opportunity to announce the creation of The Stephanie Tubbs Jones Institute for Social Justice established in the late Congresswoman's name to increase the number of African American women seeking public office and other leadership roles in public policy.

Complementing The Center's scope of activities was the preparation for the second awarding of the Fellowship named in honor of educator, devoted Delta and member of the Montgomery County (MD) Alumnae Chapter, Vivian A. Ware. The major gift made by her husband in her honor, provides a substantial stipend to a graduate student engaged in a research topic on African American women




